# UNITED PROSPECTORS INC. MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT Don Siegel 2008

With the first outing being such a great success, I expect we will have a great year. Although we did not find a lot of gold, everyone that looked for it found it. That's what it's all about, the hunt. We know that our claims have gold and have been proven producers since the original miners visited them in the 1850s. The challenge is finding new claims that will fit our organizations needs. We are currently working to eliminate the claims in our portfolio that we don't use or can't use due to the restrictions or access. Here's where we need your help. We need to hear from you when you hear of claims for sale. We would all love to have claims on the Yuba, American, or the Merced, but these big river claims are going to be very expense, as the sellers will now include the price of the estimated gold in the selling price. There is also the forest service and BLM that could impose restrictions on a group the size of ours. So with all of that said I want you know that your board of directors would love to buy more claims if only we could. So drop us an e-mail if you hear of any claims out there. Bull Creeks up next, and the water is already very low. I visited the area this past weekend and found that there is enough water to run a 4 inch dredge, with the weather due to warm up considerably this week we could get a little increase in water flow, then the water will recede rapidly after that. So plan your season now, take advantage of the water in Bull now, then move your activities up to Genesee or Twain where the water flow will hold all season long. I also want everyone to know that we will be returning our Salmon River claim to Dan Short. We acquired this claim at no expense to the organization, with the understanding that if the organization decides to get rid of the claim that it goes back to Dan first. I look forward to seeing all of you at the next outing, we will not be holding a meeting at this outing as it cuts into everyone's mining time, but we do hope to hold an open discussion time after the pot luck and raffle. Don't forget to bring those mining tools you no longer need as we typically have a swap and trade at the Bull creek outing. Look for the potluck to start about 5 pm on Saturday. See ya soon.

## THE OUTING

We could not have picked a nicer weekend to hold our 1st outing of the year, 80 degrees during the day and cool enough at night to make the campfires very enjoyable. I arrived on Friday afternoon to find the claim area to be almost full with campers and miners. I set up my tent and checked out all the activity on the claim. John Meling and I worked up til 3:00 and found a little more color and one nice piece about as big as a flattened pea. Rich Andrews is back and I found him way up the little tiny creek on the southern end of the claim. At that time he had not found any thing major yet but was working his way to the bottom of a nice deep gold trap. All in all it was a great way to spend a weekend with great people, great weather and Gold!! Who could ask for anything more. Looking forward to the next outing at Bull Creek where the gold should be better, and although we may not be able to have a campfire we can sit around the lantern and enjoy each others company. 


