

Coulterville Outing and the Haunted Room at Hotel Jeffrey by: Ron Coleman

Well, 2009 came and went in a hurry! What a year it has been. We had the issues with SB-670 that removed us from the water for dredging, the economy is kicking everybody's behind and GOLD is at an all-time HIGH!

We had our outing in Coulterville in November, and most of us stayed at the Hotel Jeffrey. I came in from Reno and met my wife. When asked what room we were given, she replied "Room 17". I laughed at her answer; she asked "what's so funny?" I told her "That's the haunted room". She just shrugged.

Coulterville was settled in 1850 by George W. Coulter, for whom it is also named. For a time Coulter lived in a tent flying the American Flag, prompting local Mexicans to call the place *Bandereta* (Spanish for "small flag"). The Maxwell's Creek post office opened in 1852 and changed its name to Coulterville in 1872. The name Maxwell honors George Maxwell, with whom Coulter cast lots to determine the name of the town. The Hotel Jeffery, established 1851, is part of the National Historic District. This is a great old hotel, Presi-

dent Roosevelt stayed there 1903. He camped with John Muir near Glacier Point in Yosemite for three days. On that trip, Muir convinced Roosevelt to take control of the valley and

the Grove away from California and return it to the federal government (Source Wikipedia). (Continued to top of page) Rumor has it he was on a horseback ride on the trail to Yosemite with the secret service, John Muir and other guests, and when they turned around, he and John were gone! They located them three days later. When asked what happened, he replied "We just wanted to do a little camping alone."



There is another rumor that the old hotel is haunted and several guest reports put more than one ghost in there. Last year, a UPI member was asking "who was in room 17 last night?" and was told "nobody" he said there was a lot of bumping and banging in that room. Later that evening I was in the bar, where there is a lot of old registers and logs in a display case. One of the logs was a guest report of haunting log. I tried to locate that log this year with no luck. Here are some excerpts from the book "California Ghost Notes Haunted Happenings throughout the Golden State".

#### Excerpts from the book ... pages 45 & 46

"We learned that the information about the Hotel Jeffery dates back to at least 1851 (some sources suggest its history goes back even further)."

"Names on its register range from presidents and royalty to gangsters and gun-slingers."

"It's Magnolia Saloon remains a popular gathering place and is

said to be 'the oldest bar in California.'"

"According to stories that have been handed down ... a number of ghostly guests have been sighted in various parts of the structure. Appropriately, the ghost that is most often observed in the saloon is that of a miner. The restaurant, on the other hand, seems to cater more to ghosts of the female variety. One such entity - thought to be the ghost of a maid who worked at the facility in the early 1900's - delights in rearranging silverware after tables have been set. In particular, knives are mysteriously moved from their customary spots and placed horizontally above the place settings. Other dining room incidents occur in the dead of night, when objects are turned upside down. Finally, the ghostly figure of a female guest has been observed both in the restaurant and on the hotel's second floor. (Incidentally, the maid who rearranges the silverware is also said to frequent the hotel. Usually her image is spotted on the staircase leading to the second floor. If you happen to visit the Jeffery, check the fourth of fifth step from the top.)"

After getting ready to see a ghost, NO LUCK, it was just not my turn in room 17 I guess.

We had the usual detector hunt, and following the hunt. We had a great dinner at the VFW hall. Then we had the raffle where lots of stuff was won by a lot of folks. 
