

Hello everyone, as we near the end of the year we can look back at another fun year. We have had many obstacles but seem to find a way to get by them. THE OUTING

We finally made it there. Three years of forest fires, it seemed like when ever we had the time to go, there was a fire. We camped at the middle camp, the one that has been hit so hard over the years, however we still found Gold, good gold. You know its good when the gold starts to travel up the one ounce finds bottle. We found a little over 1/4 ounce, not too bad. If we only worked as hard as Dennis and Patty we would have filled that bottle!

Happy Pat showed us a way to clean our concentrates; We first used a #8 screen submerged in water, in a 5 gallon bucket, hoping to find some nuggets, (we found only 3 or 4) this time. Then we pan a small amount of this screened material to remove the blond sand, drop this into a #30 screen submerged in water in a five gallon bucket. This is when Pat would say "show me the Gold"! It works well! Out of a 1/2 cup of #8 gravel panned, we were finding 3 or 4 nice pieces from each pan. There is a layer, 4-5" thick of red hard pack material that looks like terra cotta laying just on the bedrock. This red hard pack is where you will find the gold. So why are we telling you our secrets about how to find "Gold Flakes"? Well, my friends, its not the value of the gold that makes mining so fun, it's the rewards! Filling up bottles with gold, camping with your friends, spending your time in the forest, in the creek, exploring the great outdoors. We took a drive up the little road adjacent to the middle camp and found this lake called Taylor Lake. What a beautiful place to go. This lake is filled with Easter Brook Trout, just another place in our memories.

Now that we returned home, cleaned our equipment, put everything away, we can't wait to go back again, what a beautiful place! Do you think we will go again this year?? Tom, Christa, & Howard

Minutes were read, Ron Coleman made a motion to accept the minutes with amended verbiage, Chris Perry seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Treasurer, Aaron Matula: Balance as of July 31, 2008 is \$18,308.86. We had \$88.58 in withdrawals. Outstanding Checks in the amount of \$584.97. The current balance as of August 2008 is \$17,723.89.

Chris Perry made a motion to accept the treasurer report, Tom Eastland seconded the motion, motion carried.

Membership, Denise Matula: We have 67 Life members, 23 Other members, 372 Regular members total UPI members are 462. We had 10 new members this month, 18 renewing members, and I sent out 9 reminders for renewing. Also, I mailed more packets and letters today. I need 100 UPI applications. Mark corrected the membership application on the Web to 4 weeks to process membership applications and no contact phone number.

Chapters, Tom Eastland: Alameda County may consider to start a new Chapter. Tom and Christa will be going there and Tom will be doing a presentation. It was decided that we will help them get started with raffle prizes.

Ways N Means, Sid Parrish: Needs to know what the changes should be on the trifolds. He also needs to know where the next outing will be held.

Outing Coordinator, Christa Eastland: Christa is planning the Thanksgiving Dinner for Coulterville. It was decided that UPI is going to cook and supply all of the food. She wants to do a metal detector hunt again. There will also be an election for 2009/2010 Officers and Directors. Wagon Master, Robert Azbill: Absent

Technical Advisor, Chris Perry: Don and Chris "Kit" will be going around checking on Spark Arrestors and spill pads.

Claims, Chet Chastain: He has not received the tax bills from Placer, El Dorado, or Siskiyou counties and we won't receive tax bills from Tuolumne for Moccasin Creek UPI. He has recorded the annual Affidavits of Assessment Work at Mariposa and Tuolumne counties. He still has to travel to Yreka, Quincy, Downieville, Auburn, and Placerville for annual recording and BLM for filing. He has paid all of the tax bills that have been submitted and the annual rental fees that were due. Clippership will be sold at the Coulterville Outing. Chet will not run for Claims Director. He is willing to help whoever takes over the position. He has automated the procedures and is willing to port them to any standard machine that runs the usual software, namely Microsoft or Works and also is needed is a color printer/copier that prints 8.5" X 11" paper edge to edge.

Old Business: We are still planning to sell off Clippership at the Coulterville Outing.

New Business: Salmon Claim will be posted in the newsletter to see if any of our members are interested in it. If there isn't a response then we will get rid of it. The next outing in October will be at Twain.





This is new in the UPI inventory and has been little explored. This is the type of claim for those that want to be really out in the woods and rough it. There are plenty of cracks and crevices to work. Fine gold has been found laying on exposed bedrock on this claim.



DIRECTIONS (1)

ED/PUB NOTE: Both sets of directions parallel very closely. Set two corresponds directly with the mileage indications on the map. This claim sits at about 5200 feet elevation. Not an early season claim. There are sites on the way in where one may take a small motor home or trailer. It is advised that you take a scouting trip before trying to do so.

At Marysville take 20 East. Set odometer to 0 at 12th Street when you turn right onto 20 East. At 11.6 miles turn left on E21 at Marysville Rd./Brownsville. Stay on E21 all the way to La Porte. Odometer 56.9 miles when you reach Union Hotel in La Porte.

At Union Hotel set the odometer to 0. Take 120 and at .9 miles take the road to the right at the Howland Flat Rd. sign (which is on the Left side of the road). The road starts as paved and changes to dirt. At the "Y" take the left fork, which should be at 2.1 miles. Stay on the main road and at 5.2 miles you will cross the St. Louis Bridge. You may want to put your vehicle into 4 w/d at this point as the hill is a pretty steep climb. At marker A21N96 stay right. At 6.7 miles turn right onto the side road. There will be a sign at this point indicating UPI in green paint. Go past the claims marked Star Jester and Starbuster. You will come to a fork in the road and on the left will be a sign again marked UPI in green paint. Your mileage at this point will be approximately 7.35. The road is pretty rough at this point so you may want to take a look before you venture further. The rock marking Coborama is approximately 1/2 mile further. NOTE; At Woodleaf the road turns into E21/120. NOTE: When you make the turn on E21 you will encounter Flat Mining District. lots of curves and a steady climb to 4959 elevation.

DIRECTIONS (2)

Reset odometer to zero at the Union Hotel in La Porte From Union Hotel, proceed east out of town on Hwy20 At 0.9 mile turn right onto Howland Flat Road

At 2.1 bear left at 21N58

At 2.6 bear left at 21N76Y

At 3.2 bear right at 22N55Y

At 5.4 cross over the St. Louise Bridge

At 6.2 bear left at Road 31

At 6.4 bear right at 21N96

At 6.9 turn right off of Howland Flat Road onto side road with painted rock and sign indicating UPI

At 7.6 continue across the Cedar Grove Ravine to right of signs and painted tree

Stay on main trail to the end at 8.1 - you can back up the hill to turn around.

The road from 6.9 on is extremely rough - from 7.6 on it may require 4X4 depending on conditions and the type of vehicle.

This is a seasonal dredging claim. If you can get in at the right time you can dredge. However it is better suited to alternative modes of mining. It is 1/4 mile square and exploring it thoroughly may well prove very productive. The area has been drift, hydraulic and lode mined in the past. It proved highly productive. Clippership is included in the Poker
