Sid Parrish, Tom Eastland, Aaron Matula, and Denise Matula accepting the oath of office started off the meeting. Sam Wait, Treasurer will accept her pledge at the next meeting.

Motion was made by Chet Chastain and seconded by Gerald Hurt to accept the minutes. Motion carried.

- Treasurer, Samantha Wait presented by President Don Siegel: The financial report for 2005 through 2006 was presented. The total assets were \$20,290.50, with a total liability of \$15,699.38. The overall total is \$4,591.12. The checkbook balance as of October 31, 2006, was \$13,218.37; total income \$2,274.00 which leaves a total of \$15,492.37. Total Expenses \$1,404.81. January 6, 2007, Balanced Checkbook is \$14,087.56. Motion was made by Chet Chastain to accept the Treasurer's Report, Gerald Hurt seconded, and motion carried.
- Membership, Denise Matula: She would like to send self-addressed stamped envelopes with the registrations. She also would like to know if we are to accept registrations without the waivers being signed. Gerald is looking into the legalities of this.
- Wagon Master, presented by President Don Siegel: School House has been reserved for November Coulterville Outing. Until a Wagon Master can be appointed, a committee will handle the responsibilities.
- Outing Coordinator, Christa Eastland: Christa would like to contact Ways and Means regarding raffle prizes for the games that she intends to have at the outings. She will be planning a Swap Meet at the Bull Creek Outing.
- Ways and Means, Sid Parrish: Sid has new advertisers for our newsletter. He will be trying to improve the prizes for the raffles. He is hoping to have a cou-• ple of high bankers, a sluice box, and a dredge for starters. He would like a budget of \$300.00 per quarter for prizes. This was approved.



# A WORD OF CAUTION

I received this information from a trusted friend that knows far more about this computing and Internet stuff than I do and it all makes sense. I also know that in my journeys in seeking information for the newsletter, for my personal use being personally politically active that chain email petitions are not accepted as politically correct. Your elected representatives want to see that you have put some personal effort into your particular issue. That requires a personal letter, phone call or fax which will hopefully get their attention. In any case here is what chain mail can potentially do: E-mail petitions are not acceptable to Congress or any other municipality. To be acceptable petitions must have a signed signature and full address. You need to be wary of prayer chains as well. Chain e-mail is simple, takes a couple of minutes of your time and you are done. The politicos don't buy this. It requires personal effort if you want to get their attention.

Most e-mails that ask you to add your name and forward on to others are similar to the mass letter years ago that asked people to send business cards to the little kid in Florida who wanted to break the Guinness Book of Records for the most cards. All it was, and all this type of email is, is to get names and "cookie" tracking information for telemarketers and spammers to validate active e-mail accounts for their own purposes.

Any time you see an e-mail that says forward this on to 10 of your friends, sign this petition, or you'll get good luck, or whatever, it has either an e-mail tracker program attached that track the cookies and e-mails of those folks you forwarded to, or the host sender is getting a copy each time it gets forwarded. They are thus then able to get lists of "active" e-mails to use in Spam e-mails, or sell them to others that do.

If you have been participating in this type of mail, you know the why for some of the Spam. Check it out at: http://www.snopes.com/ inboxer/petition/internet.htm

Also the USPS is becoming the Spam carrier for mail. If you find marketing or political surveys or surveys of any kind in you mail do not answer them. Do not participate an any cold call phone survey. If you do you may find your mail box becoming a bigger Spam box than it already is.

# SALMON RIVER UPI 40 ACRES GPS Coordinates: N41° 17.994' ,W123° 21.852', Elevation 1085

If you plan to visit this site you may need to take some preliminary steps contacting the Orleans Forest Ranger. To get the gate opened you can call the Ranger's office at (530) 627-3291 and let them know what date and time you plan to arrive and leave the site. Reference the claim information (Claim CAMC278954, Salmon River UPI) and the specific dates you plan to visit. Request it in plenty of time for them to respond - 15 days or more. It would also be a good idea to include both your work and home phone numbers to facilitate a response. The Ranger's mailing address: Orleans Ranger District, PO Box 410, Orleans, CA 95556-0410.

The recommended route is north on Interstate 5, Highway 99. Proceed north on I – 5 through Red Bluff and Weed to Yreka. Take the State Road 3 exit to the west off of I – 5, this takes you under the freeway. Follow this road until you come to Main Street, and turn right; this a stop sign. You will now be going through town, north on 263, go about 8 miles to the junction of highway 96. Turn left; this will take you westerly along the Klamath River. Continue on 96, about 45 miles to and through Happy Camp. From Happy Camp it is about another 40 miles to Salmon River Road. You can also just stay on I-5 and take the 96 exit north of Yreka.

Turn left at Salmon River road and follow that road about 14 miles and watch for the Forest Service campground sign on the left that says Nordheimer campground. (If you cross a bridge at this point you've gone too far.) You will see as you are turning

off the main road a dirt road to your immediate left, take that road thru the gate to the first dirt road to your right, and turn there. This will take you to an opening, and you are on the claim, this is the camping area. The river is several hundred yards to the east at this point.

For those of you going north on Highway 101, go to Eureka; take 299 east to the junction of 96 at Willow Creek. Turn left, north on 96 and proceed about 30 miles to and through Orleans. About 8 miles past Orleans you will come to Salmon River Road, turn right. From there follow the directions above.

There are other ways there, but if you are pulling a trailer or driving a motor home, highway 96 out of Yreka is the best bet. It is good motoring not too twisting and turning, and not too steep. On the Salmon River Road there are a few places where things get pretty tight but not impassable. There was some 40-foot RV's there, and a truck trailer combination at about 50 feet, so it can be done. If you have a CB radio, turn it on to the channel indicated on the sign, channel 16 as I recall, where the road gets tight and check for any vehicular traffic. There are only a few areas along the road where it gets really tight.



Although gold can be found here in almost every method of recovery it

hasn't been worked much by UPI. Several people did well at the 2002 outing on this claim, and it should produce well under the right water conditions, as it did in 2002. <u>Please insert this page in your Guidebook for future reference.</u>



Karuk Tribe and the chaos that they and their been creating in Northern California regarding placer mining. (Placer mining is what we do.) If you are not aware, beginning with a

new upstart Head Ranger, in 2004 as I recall, out of the Orleans Office these scenarios combined closed down our Salmon River Claim for several years.

This is over for the time being, but not a fully handled deal, and we can again use our Salmon River Claim for now. There should be no restrictions of use other than what UPI states in our Mining Rules and Camping Rules in the Guidebook, and those indicated in page 8 of this publication. The Forest Service has a lock on the gate that leads into the camping area of our claim and they should oblige members and open the gate if you follow the procedures outlined on page 8. Should they not open the gate for our use of the claim, or tell you that you cannot use the claim as outlined in the claim notice in this issue, please get all of the particulars: Who is restricting what and by what authority, what rule or regulation says we can't use our claim? Please inform the UPI claims manager. Information needed is "who, rank, what, when where, how and why" they refuse to open the gate. This is the type of information that

we need to have on record and supply to PLP (Public Lands for the People) whom is in a great part responsible for our being able to use this claim again, at least temporarily.


