Minutes: Ron Coleman made a motion to accept the minutes and Chris Perry seconded. The motion carried.

Treasurer Aaron Matula: As of October 2008 the total balance was \$18,608.31 with withdrawals of \$1,192.02 in October, November we had a deposit of \$1,890.00, withdrawals of \$1,510.99 which left a balance in November 2008 of \$18,987.43.

Membership Denise Matula: Life members, 68; Other, 22; Regular, 371; Total Family Members, 461. We had a new life member sign up, David and Sonia Peterson of Gardenerville, NV.

Wagon Master Bob Azbill: The bill to the port-a-potty was paid late because Bob did not receive the bill before the due date. He is speaking with the company trying to get this straightened out to prevent late charges accruing. He had to pay an emergency fee for the delivery of port-a-potties for the Coulterville Outing. He wasn't aware that members would be staying on the claim.

Outing Coordinator Christa Eastland: Christa explained there would be a detector hunt in the park at 12:00. She would also be having a Lucky Butt Contest that evening. Members and guest were suppose to arrive around 4:45p.m. so that votes could be submitted. Steve told everyone that we could vote all day.

Ways and Means Sid Parrish: Needs to submit a receipt for \$425.56 for refund and he also would like to be reimbursed for 98.6 miles one way for picking up donations. He is planning to donate \$200 and the owner also said if any UPI member comes in his store to purchase anything he would give them a discount. 
