

#### **LEASH LAWS**

Leash laws are meant to be obeyed.

Our local, state and national parks are precious resources accommodating many living things, dogs included. But man's best friend can also become nature's enemy if taken off a leash and allowed to run free. A dog on the loose can be a nuisance and even dangerous. It's time for owners to take more responsibility and keep their animals tethered and safe. "My dog is nice, he'd never hurt a flea" is one excuse that the park rangers often hear. But dogs off their leash have been known to disrupt small animal habitats, challenge other larger animals (bears), and even confront rattlesnakes, which have been known to strike back with deadly consequences. If left to run free on the open trail, a dog could become trapped or injured. A dog on the run also can be exposed to ticks, poison oak and plants that have thorns and burrs. The reasons to keep your dog on a leash are many. Who, for example, wants to assume the liability if his rambunctious pet attacks and hurts another person? Some people, particularly children, are afraid of dogs-even friendly ones. Please be respectful and, remember male dogs like to mark their friends property. By doing this the other dogs know not to mess with this tent or that tire. WOW have I been blessed several times over the years. Just because we live in an area with bountiful open spaces doesn't mean we can ignore the rules of the road. Dogs are allowed on National Park Service and state parks but not on the back-country trails of the California State Parks, leashes, even retractable ones, must be six feet in length or less, and keep the leash around Fido's neck. It does no good to take it off and leave it around yours. While on the last camp out I noticed some dogs playing together in the camping area, none of them were on a leash or closely watched. Please be responsible with your beloved family pet and remember that when nature calls be responsible for the camp sites cleanliness. It could be health issue, a stinky one at that. Every dog owner enjoys watching his pet run free and there are several dog parks in the state that are perfect for that purpose. Rule of thumb: if you're not at the dog park, keep your pet on a leash and keep it under control. There have been no formal complaints at this time, it was just an observation and I'm hoping that no one takes offense. The park rangers will issue citations if warranted. It's the LAW.






