This year has not started out as I would have hoped. It has put a halt to plans that we have made for outings and has caused us to make more changes to the upcoming event schedule. I have gotten word from some of the members up north that the gates to the Gennesee claims are closed and locked. Before the COVID19 situation, the Forest Service was going to cut dead trees out and have it opened in the beginning of June. Well that plan has changed and they have not started cutting out the dead trees as of yet due to stay at home orders. The gates will remain locked for the time being and there is no date given for the reopening of that gate. For the time being the June outing to Gennesee is Canceled. Updates will be made to the website in the members section if the situation changes or an alternate site is designated for a June outing.


With that said, it is not all doom and gloom. Creeks are flowing and members have been reporting finding nice gold on several of the claims. If you are able to get out and keep your "social distance" this is the time to get out and find that new spot off the beaten path, sometimes closer to home than one might think, to find that shiny yellow stuff.

I mention closer to home because over the years I have learned that when I clean out my gear at the end of a trip and put it in to the back of my truck somehow I miss a little bit of dirt or the sluice box dries out and the vibration shakes stuff loose out of the seams or stuff falls out of the hose on the crack vacuum or just a little bit of it all. What ever it may be, I end up with sandy material in the bed of the truck and under the truck bed liner. I have learned to carefully sweep it up and vacuum it up with a shop-vac. In a good year I will fill a bucket half full with sand, leaves and other debris. I then put a hose in the bucket and start filling it up and stir up the material. This helps float out the leaves and silty material. I then carefully pan out the rest. It never fails that I find gold. Usually it is in the fractions of a gram range but several years back I had some large mats that I had used as miners moss. On that trip we had pulled out several nice nuggets and many pickers and lots of small flakes. We scrubbed the mats and picked them clean, so I thought. The gear sat in the back of my truck for several weeks under a tarp until I finally got around to putting it away. There was a bit of sandy material in the bed of the truck and I thought nothing of it. I drove all over the place and the sand worked its way up to the cab and just sat there. I finally decided to clean the truck and had noticed the sand was a bit dark in color and figured as a joke I would pan out the swept up sand. Joke was on me. There was a small, wiry picker and many small flakes and flour gold in that sandy material. I have gotten in a habit of cleaning out the truck bed on a regular basis and have started shaking out my gear in storage onto to collect the "loose sand" to pan out and sure enough I still find some gold. It
